


WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Lilypad Legacy Project





As with other playgrounds in the ASDW, it is up to the school community, including the Home & School Association, parents, alumni, Creeker families, and friends in the community to put funding in place to make our playgrounds relevant, engaging, and accessible. The current drainage issues on our playground render the majority of the play area unusable for several months each school year and our playground equipment is in desperate need of a refresh.

Over the years we've had many generous donations and volunteer hours put in to make improvements, and generally maintain the playground you see today. Expenditures for projects like these are large and even more so with rising material and supply costs. To break ground, we are asking the Garden Creek community, family, and friends to help us raise \$175,000 in donations. We are looking at all options for funding including grants and government contributions.

Phase 1: Site Upgrade

We've known for a while that the playground is wet!

Last year, we kicked off the Lilypad Legacy Project. H&S funds were used to contract a site upgrade design which focused on improving the drainage on the field and surrounding playground.



Current state: While we all know the benefits of kids playing in the mud, it is not practical during school hours!



Future state: Well drained playground and field in all seasons to maximize usage.

Why now?

Our school has struggled with drainage issues and equipment serviceability in our playground for decades. The field is often reduced to conditions similar to a wetland and our aging playground equipment has degraded to the point that much of it is out of service or not functional.

Garden Creek's playground has huge potential to be a space where, not only our students, but members of the community and surrounding areas can come to play and have a wonderful free space to gather. We have already invested in plans for improvement and now is the time to take action.

Phase 2: New and upgraded play structures & equipment
